I am writing to express my enthusiastic support for the formation of the Cure Cancer Project.

I have devoted my life to the cure of cancer. My work and that of my colleagues on the development of combination chemotherapy led to the cure of leukemia, lymphoma, most childhood cancers, testicular cancer, as well as many other types of cancers. For this I was privileged to receive the Lasker Award and was honored with the first American Association for Cancer Research Lifetime Achievement Award. I point this out only so that other readers of this letter can place my comments into proper perspective.


I believe that there is an urgent need for a focused, goal-oriented, engineering project to develop a set of drugs for the specific-cure of cancer. The plan to develop a set of drugs that target patterns of normal cellular machinery characteristic of the combination of proliferation and invasiveness is scientifically sound. A set of such drugs would have the potential to specifically cure or control all forms of solid cancers. It is likely that in total about 5 to 10 different drugs will be required in combination. A well-funded, well-coordinated, multi-institutional effort is needed to develop these drugs --- a sort of "Manhattan Project".

I am confident that the day will come when cancer is routinely cured --- without severe patient side effects. I strongly believe that the proposed Cure Cancer Project is what is needed to make that day a reality.

I am delighted to be a Founder and Senior Advisor to the Cure Cancer Project. I hope that we can rapidly form this non-profit organization, galvanize public support and support within the cancer research, advocacy, and philanthropic communities, and begin the work of developing a set of drugs for the specific-cure of cancer.

It has been my pleasure over the last five years to have had the opportunity to advise you and help nurture the foundations for this project. I have come to have the greatest respect both for you as a person and for what you are trying to do and would like to help out in all possible ways to make the Cure Cancer Project and its goal a reality.
